SHOW CAUSE NOTICE

Sir,

In compliance of the order dated 16.07.2015 of the Hon'ble High Court of Judicature at Madras in the Writ Petition (WP) No. 21512 of 2015 and M.P. Nos. 1 to 3 of 2015 filed against this Ministry's letter No. No.V12025/44/2015-DE dated 10.07.2015 regarding stopping of admissions in BDS course with 100 seats at Ragas Dental College, Chennai for the academic session 2015-16, the college was given personal hearing before a Hearing Committee and the DCI was directed to re assess the case and to verify the compliance of the college physically as per the recommendation of the Hearing Committee vide this Ministry's letter of even number dated 12.08.2015.


2. The DCI vide its letter No. DE-3(47)-2015/8714 dated 21.09.2015 (copy enclosed) stated that the Executive Committee of the DCI in its meeting held on 16.09.2015 considered the Joint Inspection Report of the Council's inspectors carried out on 14.9.2015 and decided to reiterate its earlier recommendation of 15.6.2015 to the Central Government to stop admissions in the BDS Course at Ragas Dental College, Chennai for the academic session 2015-16, due to certain deficiencies mentioned therein.

3. After considering the above findings of the DCI and critical examination of the case, it is observed that the BDS degree of the college is already recognised in 1993 with original intake of 60 seats and in 2010 with increased intake from 60 to 100 seats. The DCI have found some more additional deficiencies after its inspection carried on 14.9.2015.

4. In view of the above, you are hereby called upon your explanation within fifteen (15) days from the date of receipt of this notice by Speed Post/ email, why the procedure of derecognition of the BDS degree of your college should not be initiated, u/s 16 A (withdrawal of recognition of recognised dental qualification) of the Dentist Act, 1948. In case no reply is received within the stipulated time, it will be presumed that you have no explanation to submit and further action will be initiated against your college.
